Transcript

Welcome to Easy Stories in English, the podcast that will take your English from OK to Good, and from Good to Great.

I am Ariel Goodbody, your host for this show. Today's story is for beginners. The name of the story is *Eyes, Teeth and Toenails*. OK, I'll just explain some words that are in today's story.

When you **notice** something, you see something for the first time. For example, maybe you see your friend and your friend has had a haircut. You might say, 'Oh, I notice you had your hair cut!' Or maybe you go outside and you don't notice that it's raining, and then ten minutes later it rains more and you get very wet.

A **cavity** is a hole in your tooth. When you eat lots of sweets and don't brush your teeth enough, you might get a cavity. Maybe a part of your tooth will fall out. But sometimes you don't notice that you have a cavity. Then you go to the dentist, and the dentist tells you that you have a cavity.

Then, you get a **filling**. A filling is when a dentist puts something in your tooth where a cavity was. Fillings stop the cavities from growing bigger. In the past, fillings were black and did not look nice, but now you can get white fillings, so that your teeth still look nice. I never had fillings when I was growing up, but I have had to get two fillings as an adult.

When you **smile**, you move the sides of your mouth up. It is like a laugh, but smaller. You want to show that you are happy. If you like someone, you smile at them. In some countries, people smile a lot more than in other countries. Sometimes, Thailand is called 'the land of smiles'.

A **hammer** is a tool that you use to hit things. People use hammers to put nails in walls, and then you can hang a picture on the nail. Or you might use a hammer to break something, like a rock.

A **nail** is the hard thing on your fingers and toes. Nails grow and you have to cut them, but some people like having long nails. Some people paint their nails, and some people put on plastic nails. If you are very nervous, you might bite your nails. Of course, you cannot bite your toenails, because they are on your toes!

Sandals are shoes that are open at the front. Normally, shoes cover your toes, but if you wear sandals, everyone can see your toes. If you have very long toenails, this can be a problem! People usually wear sandals in the summer in the UK, because it is too cold at other times of the year.

Radiators are machines that make heat, that make a room hot. Radiators are usually white, and they sit on the wall. You can turn a part of the radiator, the dial, to make it hotter or colder.

Destroy means to break something completely. If there is an old building and someone wants to build a new building there, they will need to destroy the old building first. If a fire starts in your house, it could destroy all your things.

A **hero** is a person who is very brave and does very difficult things. Most often, we talk about superheroes, like Batman and Spiderman. But there are also real heroes who are normal people. For example, during the beginning of coronavirus, many people said that nurses and doctors were heroes.
